



The Mentor Project in Tanzania!

The Mentor Project is a 501c3 non-profit, bringing world class experts from astronauts to artists to mentor students around the world (for FREE). We heard about a school in rural Tanzania that has students who always test as some of the highest students in the country, but they operate on a shoe-string budget. They don't always have consistent electricity, wi-fi is not readily available, but the desire to learn is sky high. When we learned this school has never had art taught, doesn't have art supplies, and the walls of the school are unadorned, mentor Justin Thompson, a senior artist with Shulz Creative Studios, said "I'd like to teach the students how to express emotion through art using cartoons." One year later, Justin Thompson, Hanna Halper, and Laura Mason hopped on

several planes and vehicles and made it to the small town of Shirati. They were greeted by eager students, teachers and residents.

And then magic happened...
